Role definition

Role purpose

The WASH Engineer leads the technical design, implementation, and monitoring of WASH infrastructure activities within the HICRA program, while supporting WASH program monitoring and adherence to donor (USAID) regulations. This role involves conducting technical plans development and reviews, overseeing construction activities, capacity building for partner organizations and government officials, and advocating for improved technical standards in the target regions.

Key outcomes

Under the institutional supervision of the Team Lead – WASH and day-to-day management of the DCOP:

- Develop comprehensive designs, including conceptual, preliminary, or detailed plans, technical drawings, calculations, master plans, cost estimations, necessary permits, and technical specifications to guide HICRA WASH intervention as per USAID approved Construction Implementation Plan (CIP).
- Lead QA/QC planning for the WASH interventions, ensuring high-quality standards during design and construction phases by inspecting materials, performing tests, and enforcing adherence to specifications and national/international standards.
- Create a Health, Safety, and Environmental (HSE) plan in line with USAID guidelines and international standards, implementing measures that safeguard workers and communities involved in project activities.
- Conduct technical and feasibility assessments, including site investigations, to evaluate the suitability, cost-effectiveness, and sustainability of WASH interventions.
- Collaborate closely with project stakeholders to confirm project status, establish required contributions, and ensure alignment with project objectives. Maintain regular coordination with DPHE, LGRD and USAID technical team as needed.
- Monitor on-site supervision and inspection of WASH works to ensure adherence to QA/QC protocols, quality standards, and timely progress within budget constraints.
- Facilitate in scoping exercises for new WASH interventions, assessing technical requirements and providing recommendations. Prepare progress reports, consolidating key project data to communicate milestones and challenges effectively.
- Establish and oversee the project implementation team, including performance evaluation and capacity-building initiatives to enhance team expertise and project efficiency.
- Drive and manage project handover documents, including as-built drawings, final Bills of



Quantities (BOQs), materials, workforce records, and other closeout documentation, ensuring a smooth and well-documented project transition.

- Process for ensuring WASH infrastructure interventions are technically sound, meet program objectives, comply with USAID/ HICRA requirements, and adhere to national engineering and environmental standards.
