PROCUREMENT OF HIGH PERFORMANCE LIQUID CHROMATOGRAPHY (HPLC)

Issued by The Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN)

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I. PROJECT BACKGROUND AND SCOPE OF WORK

1. ABOUT GAIN

The Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN) is a Swiss-based foundation launched at the UN in 2002 to tackle the human suffering caused by malnutrition. Working with both governments and businesses, we aim to transform food systems so that they deliver more nutritious food for all people. At GAIN, we believe that everyone in the world should have access to nutritious and safe food. We work to understand and deliver specific solutions to the daily challenge of food insecurity faced by poor people. 2. BACKGROUND

The Fortification of Edible Oil Project, Phase III in Bangladesh focuses on improving access of Vitamin-A Fortified Edible Oil within the Bangladesh market, improve Quality Control and Quality Assurance (QA/QC) of Edible Oil Fortification in Bangladesh. The overall target of the project is to the reduction in prevalence of vitamin-A deficiency in the population of Bangladesh through consumption of vitamin A fortified edible oil and to ensure all edible oil are adequately fortified and available to consumers. To achieve these objective the monitoring cell of Bangladesh Standards and Testing Institution under Ministry of Industries (MOInd) working relentlessly to ensure compliance of oil refineries through regular inspection and surveillance at factory and market level. In the fortification process, vitamin A premix is an important and critical element and it is totally imported item. Thus, the quality, price and availability of vitamin A premix are fundamental to make the success of fortified edible oil program in the country. Vitamin A premix is fully imported items from several overseas sources as per convenience of oil refineries. Therefore, the quality control and purity testing of vitamin A premix is important to ensure uniform standard quality of Vitamin A premix as well as to prevent importation of counterfeit premix. However, in Bangladesh there have limited expertise on vitamin A premix purity testing till date which is adversely affecting the overall success of the oil fortification project. Therefore the project is currently working on analytical and stability testing of vitamin A premix.



3. PURPOSE OF THE PROCUREMENT

To procure HPLC machine to build capacity on analytical and stability testing of vitamin A premix (Retinyl Palmitate and Retinyl Acetate); OR vitamin A & D combined premix.

4. SCOPE OF WORK

- 1. Price quotation of Agiient 1290 series HPLC with auto sampler and DAD detector with specification
- 2. Price quotation of Shimazu HPLC with Variable wavelength DAD (UV) Detector and Double Beam with specification
- 3. Details of warranty service
- 4. Installation, test run and post installation service
- 5. Training of project personal on HPLC operation and maintenance

II. INSTRUCTIONS FOR RESPONDING

1. BUDGET/PRICE QUOTATION

Total budget/price quotation for implementation should cover all items mentioned in proposal. Value of goods and services quoted must be inclusive of all applicable charges, Value Added Tax (VAT) if applicable. GAIN will deduct applicable VAT, TAX and other Govt. levies following rules and regulations of Government of Bangladesh while payment.

- v. Risk and mitigation strategy
- vi. Timeline

4. **REVISIONS**

Proposals may be revised by electronic mail provided such revision(s) are received before the deadline.

5. ACCEPTANCE

GAIN will not necessarily accept the lowest cost or any of the Proposals submitted. Accordingly, eligibility requirements, evaluation criteria and mandatory requirements shall govern.

6. **RIGHTS OF REJECTION**

GAIN reserves the right to reject any or all submissions or to cancel or withdraw this RFP for any reason and at its sole discretion without incurring any cost or liability for costs or damages incurred by any applicant, including, without limitation, any expenses incurred in the preparation of the submission. Understanding of the scope of work:

Comprehensiveness of work plan and reasonableness of proposed time frame:

- Proposal shall include a feasible work plan to ensure successful completion of deliverables.
- The work plan details how activities will be coordinated.

Detailed budget and cost-effectiveness of proposed approach:

- Evidence of cost-effective approaches to undertaking the scope of work within the proposed budget/price quotation
- Proposal shall identify possible challenges and include creative approaches to addressing them.

GAIN reserves the right to contact the individuals and contractor(s) in order to verify the information provided as part of the Proposal.

5. REVIEW PROCESS

The review process will involve a Review Panel with participants selected by GAIN.

6. LIMITATIONS WITH REGARD TO THIRD PARTIES

GAIN does not represent, warrant, or act as agent for any third party as a result of this solicitation. This solicitation does not authorise any third party to bind or commit GAIN in any way without GAIN's express written consent.

7. COMMUNICATION

interest and could result in disqualification of the proposal.
