



DHAKA, BANGLADESH CALL FOR EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST

CALL FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST (EOI) ON PREVENTION OF VIOLENT EXTREMISM (PVE) INITIATIVES IN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS DHAKA, BANGLADESH APPLICATION DEADLINE: 25 FEBRUARY 2021 – 12:00 AM (GMT+6)

Background

Rupantar is a local not-for-profit Development Organization established in 1992. It has been working in the area of Prevention of Violent Extremism (PVE) since 2015. In 2016, Rupantar received funding from the Global Community Engagement and Resilience Fund (GCERF) to initiate a project called "Preventing Extremism through Active Community Engagement (PEACE) Consortium."

The first phase of the project was implemented during 2016-2019 in Satkhira and Chapai-Nawabganj districts. The second phase of the project started in late 2019 and, in addition to the above geographical areas, it also covers Khulna, Rajshahi city corporation, and Dhaka.

The project supports initiatives that promote youth awareness of risks and threats of violent extremism and encourages them to become active agents of change on PVE. The project is implemented in consortium with 5 organizations.

A vital component of this project is strengthening the resilience of educated youth against radicalization to violent extremism in Dhaka, which is the focus of this Call for EoI.

1. Purpose of this call

Rupantar is pleased to announce a call for the expression of interest from interested Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), Non-Government Organizations (NGOs), and youth-led organizations to receive small grants for PVE initiatives in Dhaka under "Preventing Extremism through Active Community Engagement (PEACE) Consortium" project.

2. Scope of small grants

The beneficiary groups, geographical locations, potential programming areas and implementation modalities are presented below.

Through the small grants the project aims to enable local CSOs, NGOs and youth-led organizations to propose and support youth-led PVE initiatives in close collaboration and consultation with educational institutions and local stakeholders. The objectives of this small grants are:

- To strengthen youth capacities to prevent violent extremism through increased youth knowledge and capacities on causes of VE and on PVE and increased trust between youth from different groups.
- To connect young people for youth-to-youth mobilization for PVE and peace through increased youth engagement in PVE in their communities and increased awareness of the threat of VE among youth reached through campaigning.

WHO

Youth is the building block of any society. Therefore, the project will focus on young women and men between the age of 18 and 30 studying in higher educational institutions in Dhaka.



WHERE

The project will cover up to 20 Educational institutions in Dhaka, including colleges, Madrasas and University Level institutions (Public and Autonomous Universities, Private Universities, National University Level Colleges, Fazil and Kamil Madrasas). Each small grant will support PVE initiatives in one or more educational institution/s. The list of educational institutions for each small grant will be discussed and agreed between Rupantar and successful applicants.

WHAT

Successful applicants will propose, design and carry out activities aimed at strengthening the resilience of youth in educational institutions against radicalization to violent extremism by enhancing the social cohesion and the sense of purpose of youth in these institutions. Potential thematic areas include:

- Strengthening youth resilience to violent extremism through enhancing their knowledge and skills on PVE, pluralism, diversity and tolerance and empowering them to become change agents in their society.
- 2) Enhancing youth critical thing skills through training such as social medial literacy and others to make them less vulnerable towards online and offline violent extremist propaganda.
- 3) Providing young people with skills and resources to design and organize PVE initiatives, such as art and cultural events and awareness-raising activities, to prevent radicalization, while fostering pluralism, diversity, and tolerance in their communities.
- 4) Develop alternative narratives to support PVE, through engaging religious leaders and youth in interfaith dialogues and similar initiatives.

Examples of potential activities may include:

- Creation of youth action teams in educational institutions to bring together young people from diverse backgrounds (e.g. religious, socio-economic, etc.) to come together in designing and leading PVE initiatives.
- Strengthen collaboration between youth and school principals, local and central state authorities, in organizing PVE initiatives.
- Awareness raising and training of youth on PVE.
- Enhance youth mobilization and engagement through social cohesion activities.
- Collect and share good practices in youth led PVE programming.
- Bring youth and religious leaders together to develop positive narratives to PVE.

HOW:

Rupantar will select 6 to 10 sub-grantees, where each of them will be involved in one or more of the thematic areas indicated above. Throughout grant management process, Rupantar will support subgrantees with capacity building in programmatic, finance, monitoring and evaluation (M&E), and PVE areas. A key goal of this program is to provide sub-grantees with the required capacities that will allow them to continue their work in PVE beyond the duration of this program, while increasing their chances to receive funding from international donors in the future. Moreover, Rupantar will also involve the sub-grantees in the Policy Level Advocacy Dialogue with Islamic Arab University (IAU), University Grant Commission (UGC), Law Commission and other relevant actors.



3. Value of small grants

The value of sub grants will vary from BDT 500,000 to BDT 900,000. Rupantar will sign agreements with the selected entities.

4. Duration of small grants

The duration of small grants will be up to 8 months.

5. Selection criteria

The purpose of an Expression of Interest is for interested applicants to demonstrate that they meet the required prerequisites and possess the required capabilities to receive funding under this call. Priority will be given to interested organizations with proven experience in working with youth in the thematic areas mentioned in the call. Prior experience in PVE is a plus.

PREREQUISITES

- i. Either entities with appropriate and valid legal registration¹ or having affiliation with any registered entity (e.g., University or any Higher Educational Institutions based forums, clubs or platform or societies)
- ii. Willingness to accept and fulfil the role of a Sub-grantee (as described herein)².

REQUIRED CAPABILITIES

- i. Established relationships and credibility with the young women and men aged 18 30 studying in higher educational institutions in Dhaka.
- ii. Experience and capacity in program design and management, and project cycle management.
- iii. Experience and capacity in working with educational institutions, particularly those of higher education. It will be an added value if the applicant has experience working with educated youth, including those from Madrasa schools, in programs that address local drivers of violent extremism.

6. How to Submit an Expression of Interest

All <u>Expressions of Interest</u> (annex 1) must be duly <u>filled and submitted</u> electronically to <u>eoi@rupantar.org</u> by <u>25 February 2021</u>. The e-mail should be marked as "EOI – DHAKA" in the subject line. Failing to do so might compromise your submission.

Shortlisted organizations/entities will be invited to undergo a due diligence prior to the selection decision.

¹ For the youth groups who are interested and equipped with necessary other required capabilities, the legal registration will remain subject to further consideration considering the potentiality and promise.

² Sub-grantees are anticipated to propose, design and carry out activities. Upon submission of the proposal and after getting shortlisted, the sub-grantees will go through a due diligence process. Upon agreement, the Sub-grantees will implement the agreed intervention and maintain the necessary compliance issues as agreed and signed between Rupantar and Sub-grantees.
