

Terms of Reference(ToR) for hiring consultant for developing updated Child Protection Policy of UCEP Bangladesh

1.Introduction:

The Underprivileged Children's Educational Programs (UCEP) Bangladesh is a registered non-governmental and non-profit organization providing basic education and training for children and youth from poor marginalized communities in mainly urban and peri-urban areas of Bangladesh

UCEP Bangladesh is a non-profit and non-governmental organization that aims to uplift the socio-economic conditions of underprivileged communities— especially the underprivileged children and adolescent where 50% are girls, through help to learn skills to earn. This Organization also serves children, youth (especially girls), women, persons with disabilities (PWD) and ethnic minority & other disadvantaged groups for changing their lives through education, skills training, and employment support. The average age limit of the target group is 14-18 years, basically, they are children according to UNCRC.

UCEP Bangladesh has a safeguarding mechanism that is practiced in the different tires of the organization for addressing the protection issues of those children's who are coming regularly in the schools. Child Protection Policy is one of the important tools for using protective measures for ensuring the safe and protective environment in the organization.

2. Justifications:

This Child protection policy has developed in 2015 for committed to protecting children from harm and ensuring children's right to protection under Article 19 of the UNCRC is fully realized for taking seriously the responsibility to promote child safe practices and protect children from harm, abuse, neglect and exploitation in any form for its target children those are receiving education and Skills training through 33 General and 10 Technical Schools. This policy also assessed by the DFAT and recommended for revising it that will be used as a public document.

In considering DFAT recommendation UCEP plans to review and revise the existing Child Protection Policy and Practiced for making it more user-friendly and align with the DFAT Child Protection policy.

UCEP Bangladesh is, thus, looking to procure an independent consultant (or consultancy firm) for developing up-dated version Child Protection Policy within project Inception period. The individual consultant (or consultancy firm) will prepare an action plan for developing the updated version of Child Protection Policy for using as a tool for the safeguarding mechanism for all stakeholders

3. Purpose of the Assignment

Purpose of this work is:

To review and revise the existing Child Protection policy, make it instrumental for practice
according to the recommendation of DFAT and availability of up-dated version of child
protection policy developed to apply in organizational policy and program as and when is
necessary.

4. Identified some specific objectives for addressing child protection issues.

- Identify the gaps of existing UCEP child protection policy and safeguarding mechanism and issues, implementation system and practice according to the recommendation.
- Reviewed all issues by addressing all recommendation by DFAT
- Make it a public document for all stakeholders of UCEP Bangladesh
- Prepare an action plan based on the approved policy for implementation within the organization.

5. Intended users:

- UCEP staff, use the findings of the gaps to improve the quality of these protection issues in the organization so that it would be the safer and secure environment for the children.
- 'Targeted Beneficiaries', particularly UCEP Students, instructors, teachers and other relevant of staff involved in the project and programme, to better understand effective policies for bringing about changes in their studying and training environment

 UCEP programme and policy staff, especially in regards to the What Works to promote and ensure Child friendly environment and increase safety

6. Scope of work

- It is intended that a team of reviewer will: review content of the existing child protection
 policy, align with the national and international policy (Including DFAT Child Protection
 Policy) and practiced from the secondary data source, intervention system, protection
 mechanism and present role of responsible people such as: role of CCM/YCM, Child
 Protection Focal Persons, Child Protection Committee, uses of complain box etc.
- The revised child protection policy needs to be instrumental enabling UCEP to use it for building capacity of staff and the organization focused child protection and code of conduct for staff.
- ➤ Mechanism of regular training on Child Protection Issues for all staff, including teachers instructors needs to be addressed for raising awareness and enhance their capacity for implementation .
- Child protection issues must be addressed for the newly recruited staff during their induction training.
- Arrange refresher training for all staff at least within 2 years.
- Organizational risk assessment to take place on child protection issues in every six months and take several actions for mitigation of these risk.
- This policy has to contained provisions for suspensions or transfer to other duties of any
 employee who is under investigation and provisions to dismiss any employee after the
 investigation of UCEP's employment contract.
- Its need to be kept a file note where verbal consent is obtained in regards to use of children' images before photographing or filming a child for work-related purposes
- The intention is to undertake a rigorous review of existing policy and total safeguarding mechanism that are using in the different schools, institutions and office level. Following these process consultant will do his/her work:
- The work plan needs to be developed and shared with UCEP Bangladesh for finalization.

- The methodology and tools to be reviewed and revised for collecting information and share with UCEP Bangladesh.
- Relevant national and International policies and strategy of child protection issues and best practices from secondary data sources to be reviewed.
- Field visit, interaction with field staff, observation, interview, workshops and meeting with internal staff, external relevant organizations and agencies.
- Identify the internal gaps and share the key findings with UCEP Bangladesh Team.
- Prepare and share the draft policy documents with DFAT
- Finalization of the Child Protection policy incorporating inputs from UCEP Bangladesh and DFAT.

7. Deliverables:

To develop an advanced, progressive and forward-thinking Child Protection Policy for UCEP is needed a high level of expertise. The expert consultant/consultant Firm will facilitate staff workshop in the field and prepare a revised updated Child Protection Policy included the gaps and will submit to the UCEP management. Detailed scope of the works of the consultant or consultation Firm will be guided by TOR for the developing of the Child Protection Policy.

Specific tasks will be as follows

- Develop and share a detailed work plan for the entire work.
- Develop and share methodology and tools within the timeframe.
- Submit an Inception report to UCEP Bangladesh within the timeframe.
- One or two field visit and organize workshops for understanding the present mechanism of Protection system and implementation situation of the organization.
- Share the key findings with UCEP Bangladesh through Power Point Presentation.
- Develop a draft policy and share with UCEP Bangladesh.
- Submit final updated Child protection policy including all finding

8. Time Frame of the assignment

The total numbers of person-days allocated for this work are 36 working days that will be spread over 59 calendar days tentatively starting from May 26, 2019, to August 22, 2019.
